Our theme this year is "Shaping the Future: The Evolving Role of Zoos and Aquariums in Society by 2050".

At a time when the world is rapidly evolving, we invite you to join us in exploring what it means to be a progressive zoo or aquarium. As key cultural and conservation institutions, it is crucial that we not only respond to societal changes, but also play an active role in shaping societal opinions, attitudes and behaviours towards biodiversity and the role of zoos and aquariums.

Our programme will be lined with interactive sessions and workshops designed to inform us and, hopefully, broaden our perspectives. Invited speakers from within and outside the EAZA community will share their views on trends (in society, conservation, animal care) that will shape the landscape in which we will operate in the next decades. In a year of important EU elections, we will look at opportunities and challenges in policy making and at practical ways in which each zoo/aquarium Director can become more engaged. We will address how biodiversity connects with the respect for human diversity in our communities. And, like every year, we will make time for an open discussion about topics you would like to bring up.

In addition, we will hold the Annual General Meeting as well as meetings of Council and several committees.

We invite you to share, learn, and build on each other's vision for the strategic direction of our zoos and aquariums.
